WHEREAS the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 was signed into law on October 30, 2000, placing new emphasis on state and local mitigation planning for natural hazards and requiring communities to adopt a hazard mitigation action plan to be eligible for pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and

WHEREAS, a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was prepared by Cedar and Dixon Counties, with assistance from JEO Consulting Group, Inc. of Lincoln, NE.

WHEREAS the purpose of the mitigation plan was to lessen the effects of disasters by increasing the disaster resistance of the Counties and participating jurisdictions located within the planning boundary by identifying the hazards that affect the Lewis and Clark Natural Resources District and prioritize mitigation strategies to reduce potential loss of life and property damage from those hazards, and

WHEREAS FEMA regulations require documentation that the plan has been formally adopted by the governing body of the Lewis and Clark Natural Resources District in the form of a resolution and further requesting approval of the plan at the Federal Level; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the governing body of the Lewis and Clark Natural Resources District does herewith adopt the Cedar and Dixon Counties Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update.
