- 3. <u>Daniel & Lisa Sudbeck well permit LC-433 for a well in the NESE Section 7, T32N, R1W, expanded acres permit X-23033 for 133 irrigated acres in the SE Section 7, T32N, R1W, and flow meter cost share FMLC-433.</u>

- 1. To take no action on Aowa structure 41-3 to place riprap along the lake is it is functioning as intended.
- 2. <u>To work with Nebraska Game & Parks to determine need and location as well as financial support to purchase picnic tables, fire rings, and solar lighting for Buckskin Hills, Powder Creek, and/or Chalkrock Wildlife Management Areas using budgeted maintenance funds.</u>
- 3. <u>To approve reinstating the NSWCP cost share percentage to 65% for tree planting cost for 2022 and future funding years.</u>
- 4. To approve adding telemetry to monitoring wells in the observation network.
- 5. To approve selling the old 4-wheel trailer to the highest bid.
- 6. <u>To approve the planning committee recommendation as approved at the May 18th meeting with the exception of the 5% increase for health insurance premiums as there were no recommended increases from the NARD Insurance Committee for FY2024.</u>
