

# 2026 CONSERVATION TREE PROGRAM LEWIS AND CLARK NATURAL RESOURCES DISTRICT



Each spring, the Lewis and Clark Natural Resources District (LCNRD) distributes tree seedlings and provides planting services for conservation purposes such as windbreaks, shelterbelts, and wildlife habitat. Orders are accepted from October 1st through March 31st. Planning assistance is available through local Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) offices to prepare tree-planting plans that meet conservation needs.

TREE ORDERS - Order deadline is March 31, 2026 (place orders early to ensure availability either at LCNRD or NRCS)

<u>LCNRD MACHINE PLANTED TREE SEEDLINGS</u> – April, LCNRD will inform landowners of the intended planting schedule for sites that will be planted through the NRD program. If ground is in sod, it must be fall prepared. Contact local NRCS for ground preparation needs to ensure the site is prepared properly. When installing weed barrier, tillage strips need to be a minimum of 8 feet wide for proper installation.

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#### THINGS TO REMEMBER:

Windbreak design and cost share for windbreaks are available through your local NRCS. Cost share applications must be approved before beginning any work. Receipts will be required for all reimbursements. Site preparation is recommended to be completed in the fall before planting occurs. Landowners are responsible for site preparation including flagging, discing, roto tilling, ripping, and/or chiseling. If the site is in any kind of sod, roto tilling is required for planting.

Expect to pay for seedlings and weed barrier at the time a tree plan is drawn up. Tree planting services will be billed after the trees are planted. Weed barrier installation will be billed by private contractor. Rolls of weed barrier, weed mats and staples are available through LCNRD.

LCNRD will send a letter to inform all machine planting cooperators of the planting start date. The letter will be final notice to have the site prepared. There is a "Go Back Charge" if the site is not prepared of \$4.00/mile round trip.

If purchasing weed barrier, you will need to line up a **Weed Barrier Installer.** Minimum tillage strips **8 feet wide** are needed for installation.
